Since the liberalisation of the European telecommunications sector, cable TV operators have invested billions of Euros in building fibre-coax networks connected into more than 100 million homes in Europe. Cable's end-to-end networks deliver +100Mbps Internet connection, High Definition TV, and telephony services. As key enablers of digital life, cable TV operators provide their services fully independent from incumbent telecommunications operators. Hence, cable brings a new dimension to the e-communications market: large-scale infrastructure based competition.
